Currency	Euros. Foreign exchange is available from reception on deck 8. Major credit cards are accepted in most shops, cafes and restaurants. Bank and ATM machines are available in the town centre.		
Language	The official language is French. There's a mix of French and Italian spoken, although English is spoken and understood in many tourist areas.	Tourist information	Situated at port gates, in the terminal and in town.
Getting around			
Taxis	Available at the port gates and there's a taxi station at Foch Square. A general guideline with taxis is a 10 minute journey cost around 10 Euros per taxi	Main highlights	<p>Corsica is the fourth largest island in the Mediterranean sea. Although the island is separated from the mainland by the Ligurian and Mediterranean Seas, politically, Corsica is considered to be part of Metropolitan France. Corsica's most famous inhabitant, Napoleon Bonaparte was born in Ajaccio in 1769.</p> <p>The 'Maison Bonaparte' is situated on Rue St Charles and is the birth place and childhood home of Napoleon Bonaparte. Please note most museums will be closed on Mondays.</p> <p>Visit Ajaccio's 16th Century Cathedral, dedicated to La Madonuccia, the city's Patron Saint who is thought to have protected the residents from the Black Plague. The Cathedral of Ajaccio houses Napoleon's baptismal font.</p> <p>Palais Fesch is located in Rue Fesch and opens 10.30am - 6pm</p> <p>Musee d'Histoire Corse Mediterranee A Bandera (Historical museum) Open 10am - 5pm</p> <p>Enjoy a rest in the Place Foch, the city's finest square, lined with palm trees, it features a statue of Napoleon atop a fountain facing the Gulf of Ajaccio.</p>
Local buses	A yellow open top tour bus "Ajaccio Vision" is available in front of the harbour. This costs around 10 Euros per person and lasts about 1 hour. Starting from town, it continues up to the Sanguinaires view point.		
Other transport options	'Le Petit Train' - tours are available in front of the harbour. It costs around 10 Euros per person, it gives you an introduction to the nearby area, lasting around 1 hour.		
Distance to town centre	5 minutes walk.		
Best way to reach the centre	You can walk to town easily. Just go through the terminal, turning left and follow the palm trees and head into town.
