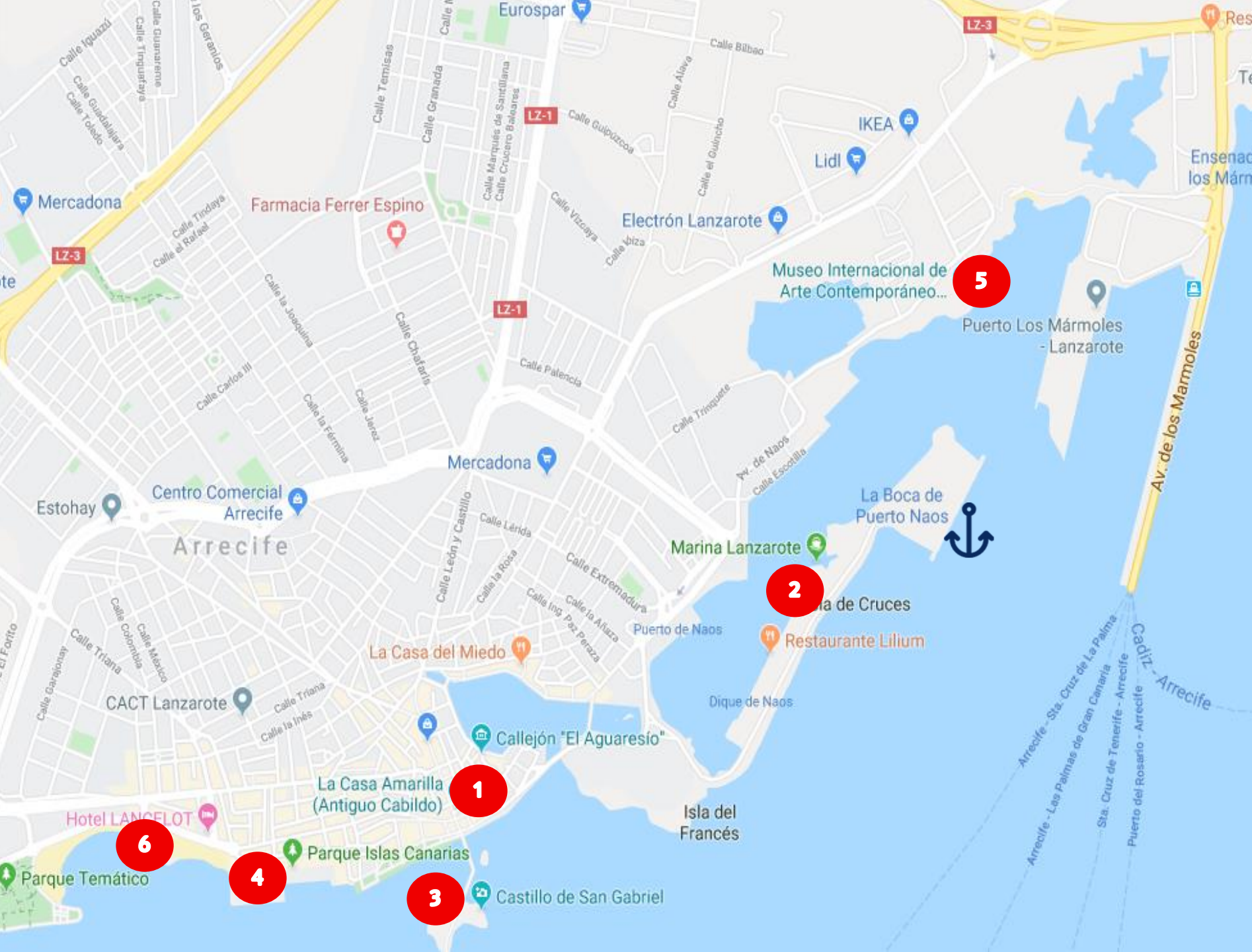
Ship's Location

AT A GLANCE

Lanzarote is a great place to explore. This unique and mesmerising moon landscape is a geological wonder. The volcanoes have shaped and coloured the island for centuries. The most recent volcanic eruptions from 1730 – 1736 have covered over a quarter of the island's surface. It is just another chapter in the ongoing process and the geological formation of the island. Therefore Lanzarote is a living laboratory for scientists.

Arrecife is a sleepy, traditional town, which can easily be covered in around an hour or so. The distance to Arrecife town is an approximate 20 to 25 minute walk.

DON'T MISS OUT ON

San Ginés Church: This attractive church is built of dark, volcanic stone and is whitewashed, as a gleaming tribute to San Ginés - Arrecife's patron saint.

La Recova Market: Located between Avenida León y Castillo and Charco de San Ginés, the historical town market has a few stalls selling handicrafts.

Castle of San Gabriel: Originally a wooden fortress, this castle was built in 1573 as a defence for Arrecife, against pirates and attacks from North Africa. It was unfortunately destroyed a few years later, by a fire. Over the years, the castle has undergone major restoration works, and it's now a striking landmark in Arrecife.

The International Museum of Contemporary Art: Housed in a fortified 18th century castle, this small museum showcases art pieces of local artists of Lanzarote. Inside there is a restaurant which offers great views overlooking the port. There is a small entrance fee.

Beaches: There are a number of small beaches in Arrecife. Near the port is Playa de La Arena, which is a small secluded beach. A bit further afield is Playa Reducto, which is a bigger beach, boasting golden sands.

Shopping: The main shopping street in Arrecife is Calle Real, which is located in the heart of the city.

EXCURSION OF THE DAY

Timanfaya & it's Volcanoes: If there's one place you HAVE to go in Lanzarote, it's Timanfaya National Park. Born out of fiery volcanic eruptions, this corner of Lanzarote is all craters, calderas and cones. Drive through the barren landscape taking in the luna-like scenery for a brief stop at Restaurant El Diablo. Here local guides will perform amazing volcanic experiments using all 4 elements, such as turning brushwood into fire and cups of water into steaming geysers. Leaving Timanfaya behind continue to Los Hervideros, which literally translates to "boiling waters". This complex of caves and blowholes was formed by boiling lava meeting the Atlantic Ocean. Your final stop will be at La Geria winery, where you will get the opportunity to taste the famous Malvasia variety.
