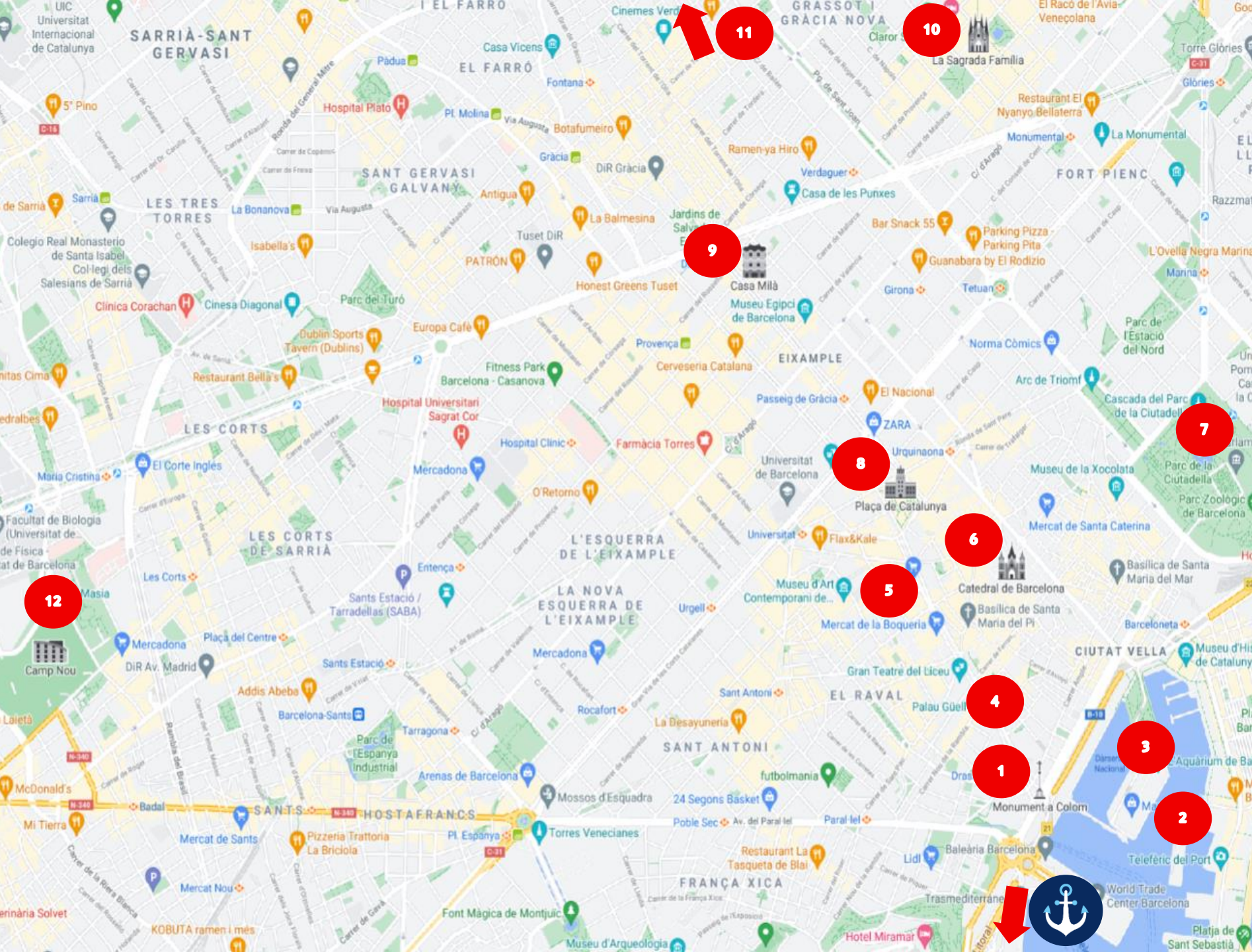

## AT A GLANCE

The port offers a chargeable shuttle service, which drops-off near to World Trade Centre Avenue. This service usually costs around €3 for a single or €4.50 for a return ticket. Tickets need to be purchased on the bus. Alternatively, taxis can be found outside the terminal building. Expect to pay around €1 a minute. If you wish to walk into the city, this will take around 45 minutes to 1 hour depending on our docking location.

Within the city there are generally Hop-on Hop-off buses available which offers three sightseeing routes. Tickets can be purchased on the bus from outside the World Trade Centre or from near to the Christopher Columbus Monument.

## DON'T MISS OUT ON

**The Museu Picasso:** Containing the world's most important collection of Pablo Picasso's early paintings, drawings and sketches. There is a fee to enter the museum and you may need to pre-book in advance.

**The Sagrada Familia:** Come and see the unfinished final piece of architecture from Antonio Gaudi's impressive structure towers over the city. This place has been under construction for over 138 years and counting. There's a fee to enter, and you will need to pre-book in advance.

**Cable Car:** There are two stations - one at the top of Montjuic Mountain and one at Barceloneta port. To reach Montjuic, it's a steep uphill walk of around 45 minutes, or a 5 minute taxi ride.

**Beaches:** Barceloneta beach is one of the most popular beaches in Barcelona and can be reached by cable car from Montjuic or by bus from the Columbus Monument. Bars and restaurants are dotted along the beach.

**Shopping:** Las Ramblas is the most famous street in Barcelona, running 1.5km long through the city and is dotted with street entertainers, artists and a wide variety of shops.

**As a result of current restrictions, you may need to pre-book when visiting an attraction. We recommend checking the relevant website for more information.**

## EXCURSION OF THE DAY

**Barcelona City Tour:** Few cities of the world can boast such architectural richness and culture as the electrifying metropolis of Barcelona. This extensive tour of the city takes in many of the major highlights, including the Old Quarter and the city's most eccentric landmark - Gaudi's Sagrada Familia. Work on this church began in 1882 and still continues today. If you're a first time visitor to Barcelona, don't miss the chance to see it. Another 'must see' attraction you'll visit is The Spanish Village, where you can see many examples of Spanish architecture. Enjoy the arts and crafts shops and spend some time shopping before taking a drive through Montjuic Gardens.
