The official currency is Eastern Caribbean Dollar however, US Dollars are widely accepted.

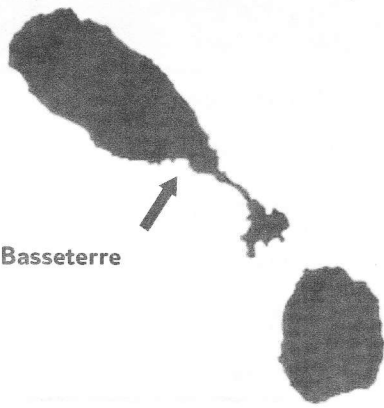

GETTING ABOUT

The Cruise port in Basseterre is split up into two parts. If we're docked in Port Zante, you will see that this is only a short walk from the port into the town, approximately 10-15 minutes on foot. If we're docked in the Deep Water Port then from here it's approximately a 30-40 minute walk from the port into the town centre and a complimentary shuttle bus service will operate.

Alternatively, taxis are available on the quayside. You'll see that price lists are posted around the port. Look out for the taxis that have yellow license plates starting with the letter T or TA, they are the recommend services to use and it's always best to confirm the price before setting off.

Public bus services with a green license plate starting with the letter H are available from the port. There are 5 main bus routes on St Kitts. No public buses travel southwards to the main resort areas in Frigate Bay and the South East Peninsula.

SHOW STOPPER

Brimstone Hill Fortress

Brimstone Hill Fortress National Park is a UNESCO World Heritage Site, a preserved fortress on a hill on the island of St. Kitts, It was designed by British military engineers and maintained by African workers.

CULTURE VULTURES

St Kitts Scenic Railway

The railroad was built almost a century ago to carry sugar canes from the fields to the sugar mills. These days, the double-decker trains are just a nice way of seeing the island.

North Frigate Bay

North Frigate Bay is the nearest with umbrellas and chairs for hire. It's a 10 minute taxi ride and it costs approximately \$10.00 US Dollars per taxi, one way. Or perhaps Friars Bay, which is the next bay along.
