Approximately.



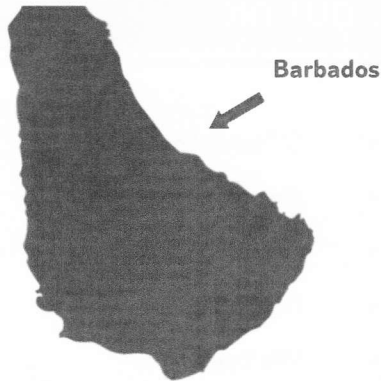

GETTING ABOUT...

When we arrive into Barbados Cruise port, we will be docked in the local area of Bridgetown which is the gateway to postcard perfect beaches and duty free.

If you are looking to head out into the local town you will find that this is easily accessible to do as the Deepwater harbour where we are located is only a mile north from the city centre of Bridgetown.

When you leave the cruise ship, you will need to walk along the quayside into the main terminal building to exit out of the port, once you have exited the terminal you can enjoy a scenic walk into the town through the cruise public carpark along the stone seawall which should take approximately 15 minutes to reach the town.

You will also find local taxi services from outside the port terminal, it is always best to negotiate a price with the taxi services before heading out, alternatively there is a local bus terminal located around the corner from the cruise port behind the Pelican village which can take you further afield but you will need to purchase your bus tokens from within the bus terminal before getting on.

JUST SO YOU KNOW...

As we arrive into Barbados on a Sunday, please be aware that some facilities may be closed or may open later on in the day.

As with all tourist cities, pick-pockets can operate in crowded areas so please be mindful of your possessions.

SHOWSTOPPER SIGHT

Harrisons Cave

Go underground with a visit to Harrison's Cave. All limestone stalactites, caverns and grottoes, it's like taking a trip to the moon. Add rock pools, streams, red moonlighting and it will be somewhat like a volcano.
