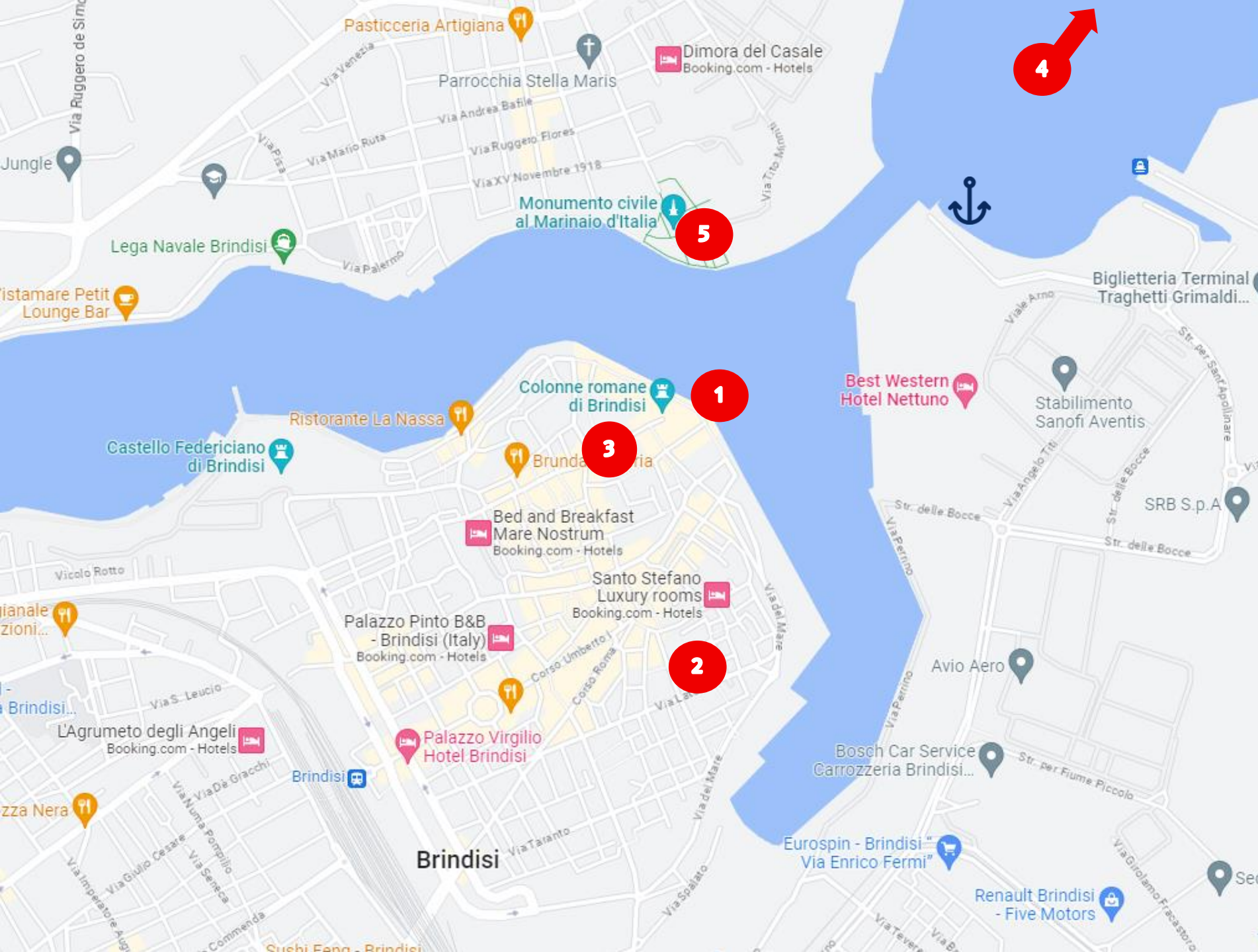
Ship's Location

AT A GLANCE

Flanked by aquamarine waters, olive groves and vineyards, Brindisi is certainly easy on the eye. The city itself is a picturesque mishmash of whitewashed houses and Roman churches that tumble down the hillside. Stroll its narrow streets, and you'll pass pizzerias, coffee shops and ice-cream trattorias.

The cruise port is located a 15 minute walk along the promenade to the city centre, allowing quick access to explore this historically rich city.

The promenade which runs along the seafront is a nice area to explore, offering beautiful views of Brindisi port, bar and restaurants. From the port you can see the "Castello Alfonsino" (Aragonese Castle), also known as the "Red Castle", which was historically used for defending the city.

Local tax's will be available outside the port gate to take you into town, usually these taxis are on a metre 1 Euro for 1 minute.

DON'T MISS OUT ON

Castello Alfonsino di Brindisi: This historical castle is located on the northern edge of the port and was constructed in the 16th century. It was used as a defensive fort to protect the port of Brindisi during the wars.

Brindisi Archaeological Museum: This museum houses artefacts from Brindisi and the surrounding areas dating back to the Roman era.

Lecce: The town of Lecce is set on the south-eastern tip of Italy's boot, and it showcases some of the most impressive Baroque architecture in the country.

Shopping: There are plenty of small boutiques in the alleyways of the Brindisi city. As well as bars and restaurants dotted around the streets.

EXCURSION OF THE DAY

The Village Of Alberobello: On this tour, we'll take you to the town of Alberobello, which is unlike anywhere else in the world. It's known for its unusual cone-shaped rooftops, which are called 'trulli', and it's so unique it's been given UNESCO World Heritage status. White-washed, limestone houses line the streets, topped with the trademark 'trulli' and covered in ivy. And, in between them, spindly pathways wind upwards, freckled with potted fuchsia blooms. You'll get a chance to explore the place on foot, before making your way to the Church of Saint Anthony. Perched on a hillside, the structure overlooks the entire village, offering up the best views of Alberobello.
