Port information

Currency

The currency used is Euros however debit and credit cards are widely accepted. Banks and ATM machines are available in the centre and currency exchange is also available at reception on Deck 4.

Language

The official language used is Spanish, however, English is widely understood.

Getting around

Distance to town

The city centre is within walking distance from the port terminal, follow the walkway from the terminal building. It's approximately a 15 minute walk.

Main highlights

By far the most impressive building in Cadiz has to be the Cathedral with its dome and huge towers.

Cadiz Town Hall is one of the most important buildings in the city. Pick up a guide book from the tourist information office for a guided tour of this interesting building and pay a visit to the beautiful Hospital building where you can see the impressive central patio. Also worth a visit is the church of San

Pópulo to La Viña.

Juan

You will find several museums in the city; The Municipal History Museum and the Fine Arts Museum offer excellent art collections and are located in the same building. It's also pleasant to walk through some of the pretty squares, such as San Juan de Dios, Mina, Constitución, España and Mentidero, each of which has its own style and monuments, all very unique, as are the different quarters of the centre from El

Sierra de Grazalema Natural Park is one of Andalucía's most visited parks, renowned for its wildlife, rugged limestone landscape and great hiking territory. Located in a prime spot for viewing the twice-yearly migration of birds between Europe and Africa.

Taxis

To reach the main town, taxis are not needed as it is so close. However if you want to travel further afield, you will be paying approximately 1 euro per minute.

Local Buses

Local city buses in Cadiz run daily and regularly throughout Old Cadiz and into New Cadiz. All local buses depart from 'Plaza Espana'. You can also find timetables here. Bus number 1 runs from Plaza Espana and into the New Cadiz. The main avenue or 'La Avenida' begins where Old Cadiz ends and stops at the final beach of Cadiz, Cortadura beach. Bus numbers 2 or 7 are also very useful as they run along the coast, stopping at each beach on the way.

Hop-On Hop-Off

The City Sightseeing Hop-On Hop-Off bus runs from just outside the cruise terminal from 10.00 and at every 15-20 minute intervals. There's 12 stops to get on and off at and the highlights include; Torre Tavira, Cadiz Museum and Cadiz Cathedral. To skip the queues you can get your ticket from Destination Services during their opening hours or once you're on the hus

Essential information

Tourist information

There is no tourist information in the cruise terminal.

There are a variety of internet cafés in the city centre,

which offer Wi-Fi access with a purchase.

Nearest beaches

Cadiz is famed for its golden sand beaches stretching for miles. La Victoria Beach, which is the main city beach with all of the amenities for all to enjoy, is located 15 minutes from the port. You could take a taxi to get there. Or approximately a 35-40 minute walk will take you to Playa de la Caleta.

Shopping

PLEASE NOTE: As with all tourist destinations please keep a close eye on valuables Cadiz shopping includes covered markets and a large shopping mall selling a wide range of goods. The tiny shops in the narrow streets of the old town often have unusual souvenirs and handy crafts.

The Plaza San Juan de Dios has winding streets filled with small shops and boutiques. El Corte Ingles department store is located on Avda. de las Cortes de Cádiz 1.
