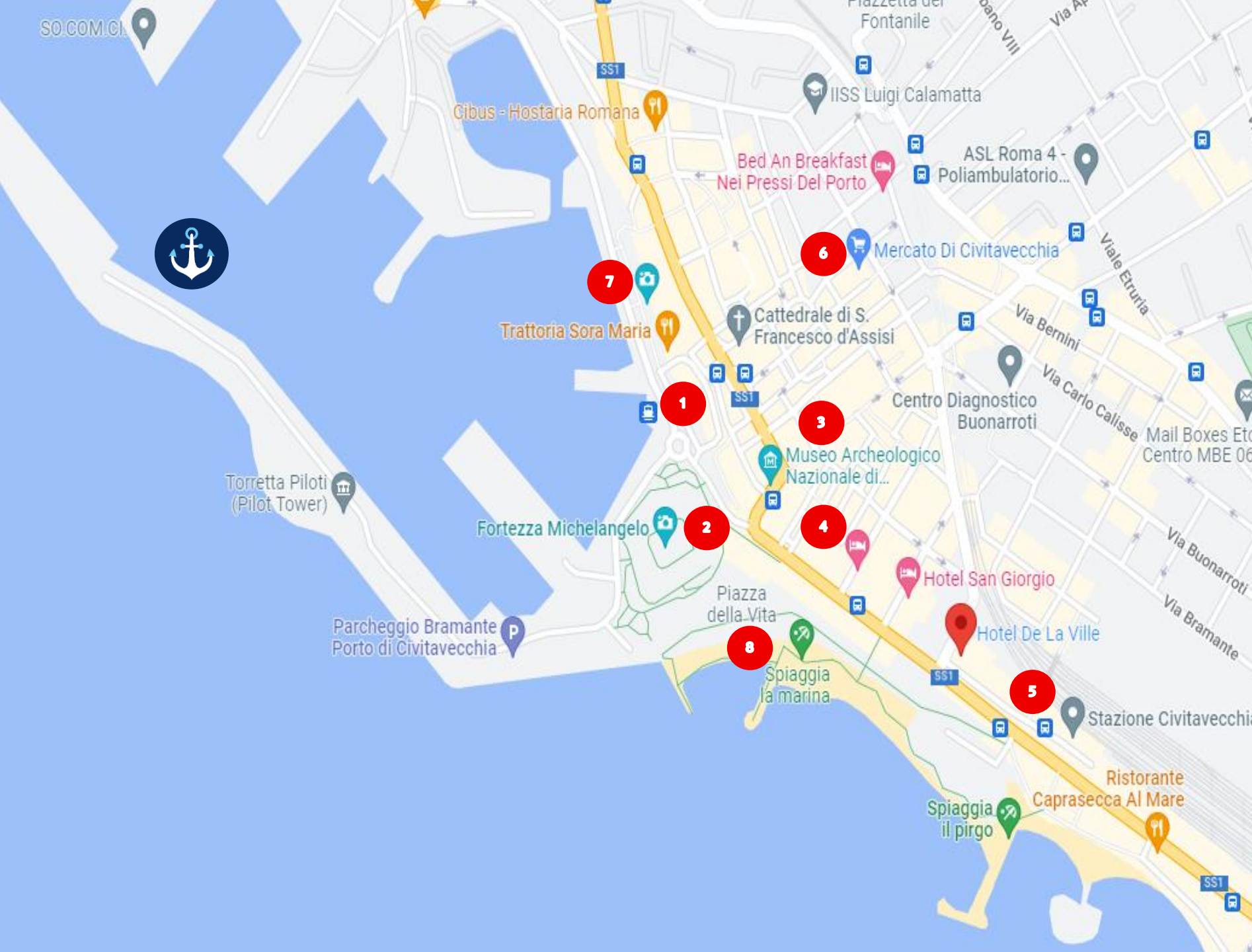


SHIP'S LOCATION

AT A GLANCE

There is a complimentary shuttle bus run by the port to take you to Civitavecchia town as the dock can be a fair walk from the town. The shuttle bus service will drop you at the fortress just by the downtown area. There are no set times for the shuttle bus, they run on a constant loop throughout the day. If you do fancy stretching your legs you can walk out of the port from the ship. Just follow the direction of the fort, depending on our docking location this can take around 20-30 minutes.

If you want to head into Rome, it's around 1 hour and 30 minutes drive. If you fancy heading to Rome on your own steam you can catch the train from Civitavecchia to Termini Roma, you can also grab a bus service from the ship to the train station which costs €3 each way, it says 'Train Station' on it. If using trains in Italy, remember to get your ticket validated. Train strikes are quite common Italy so be sure to give yourself enough time to get back to the ship.

Taxis will be available outside the ship. Remember to agree a price with your driver before you set off. Taxis to Rome cost approximately €200. Or alternatively you could hop on one of our Rome On Your Own transfers which can be booked with Destination Services. The Hop-on Hop-off bus is a popular way to get around Rome once you've made your way into the city.

Colosseum: The Colosseum is the largest amphitheatre built during the Roman Empire, used for gladiator fights, animal hunts and executions. Entrance costs around €16 but queues for both tickets and entry can be quite lengthy.

Vatican City: The world's smallest state is also the headquarters of the Roman Catholic Church. It's home to the Pope and the Vatican Museums.

Via Condotti: Once you've taken in the Spanish Steps, you may want to splash some cash in the shops, Via Condotti is the perfect place to get your shopping fix.

Renaissance masters such as Michelangelo, Raphael and Bernini worked on its design to create an unparalleled masterpiece. This is an ideal trip for first timers to Rome.
