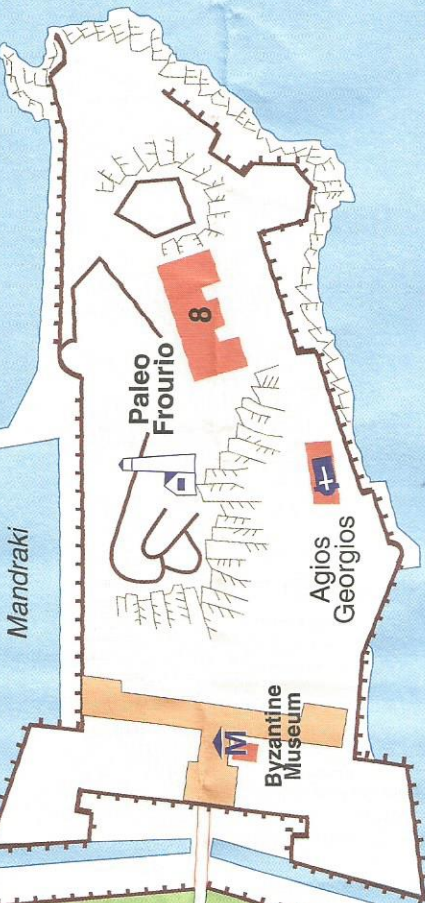

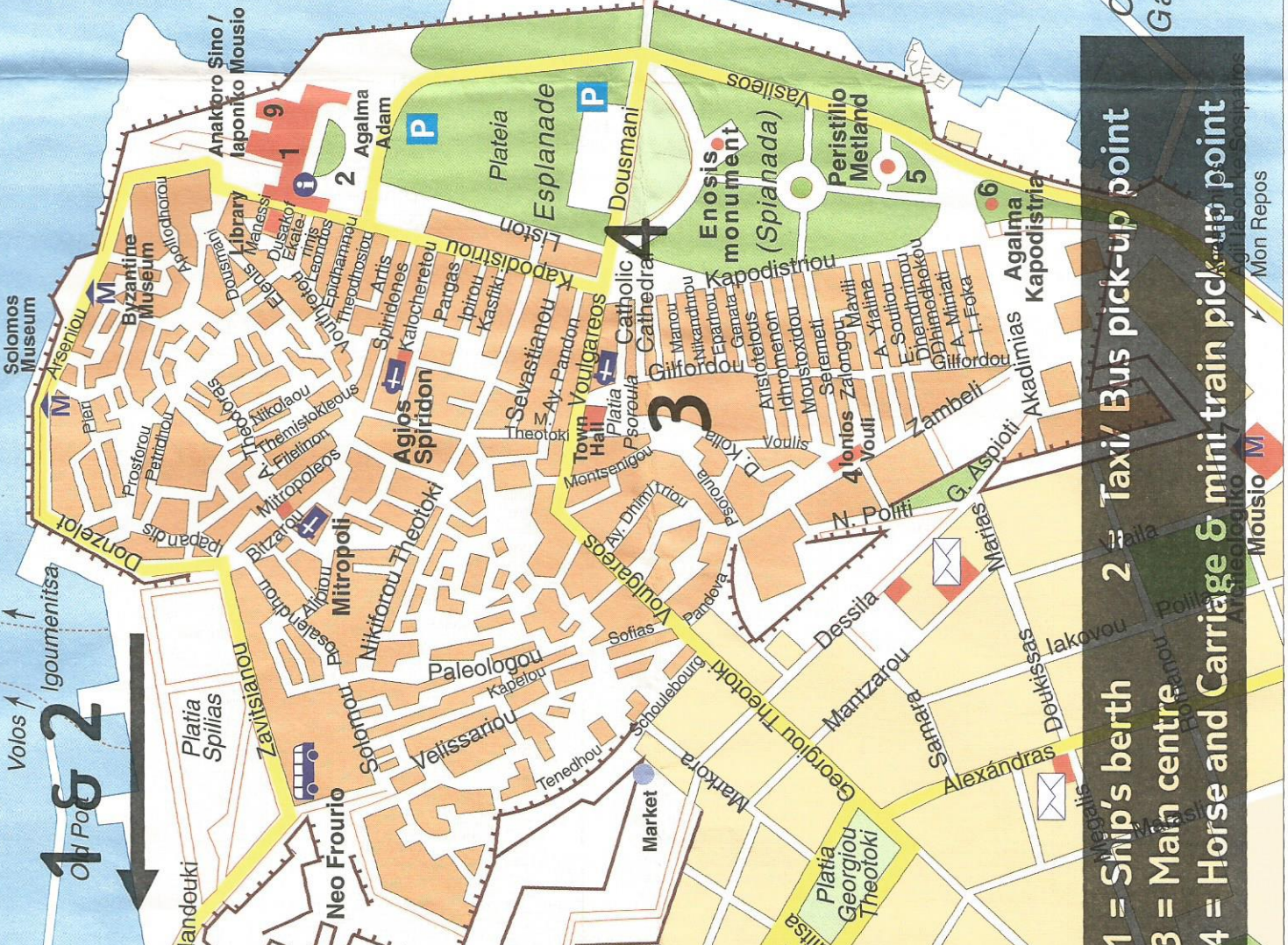

Port information

Currency	The currency in Corfu is the Euro. Major credit cards are accepted in most shops, cafés and restaurants.	Language	The language in Corfu is Greek.
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Getting around

Distance to town centre	From the port, it's around 2.4km to the old quarter of Corfu Town.	Main highlights	Visit Corfu Town with its Venetian influences, the fortresses both in the new & old ports provide amazing views and are open daily between 09.00 – 21.00. There is a small admission fee. It is also worth a visit to the Church of Agios Spyridon , in the Old Town patron saint of the island, whose body is said to have healing powers. The Kanoni Peninsular is located 4km from Corfu town and Mon Repos Villa , at its northeast tip, was Prince Philip's birthplace. The beautiful wooded grounds are open daily between 09.00–20.00. Paleokastrita -This cluster of coves is surrounded by lush forest and is one of the most popular spots on the island. From here, you can take a boat ride through the caves.
Getting about	Walking to the town centre will take approximately 30-45 minutes. The port provides a complimentary shuttle bus service that runs regularly throughout the day to take you from the ship to the terminal building only depending which berth we dock at. There is a public bus service outside the terminal building in the parking area and costs approximately €1.70 one way, to Corfu Town's old quarter. In the Old Town there are horse drawn carriages and a tourist train which takes in the historical centre of Corfu Town. Please note that the tourist train normally runs during high season. If it is running, it departs from McDonalds every hour.		
Taxis	Taxis are available outside the terminal building. The price can vary depending on where you would like to go, a taxi to the centre will cost approximately €10 one way. Taxis here are not often metered so agree a price before you start your journey.		
Local buses	The bus from the new harbour will drop you off at San Rocco Square; from here, you can get buses to Couvia, Dasia, Ipsos, Achilleion, Benitses and Pelekas.		

Essential information

Tourist information	Located in the Cruise Terminal.	Shopping	The main shopping street is Theotoki in the new town. This is where all of the Greek boutiques are situated; there is even a small M&S. Most shops will close for siesta between 13.30 and 16.30 and will re-open until 20.30. The majority of shops in the old town, especially in the streets leading off the Esplanade & opposite the cricket field tend to remain open all day.																																						
Internet access	Internet is available in the Cruise Terminal. You will be able to connect to Wi-Fi in most bars and cafes.	PLEASE NOTE:	As with many major cities, please keep a close eye on valuables.																																						
Nearest beaches	The nearest beach is in Dassia, which is approximately 15 minutes away (10km).
