Port information

Currency

The currency in Croatia is Kuna. The Nearest ATM machine is located in the bus station which is just outside the port gates. You can also find ATM's around the city. Major credit cards are accepted in most shops, cafes and restaurants. Government buildings $\boldsymbol{\delta}$ buses only except Kuna.

Language

The language is Croatian, but in touristic spots you can also use English.

Getting around

Distance to town centre

The Dubrovnik cruise terminal is located at Gruz district. It's about a 40 minute walk to the old city centre.

Main highlights

Getting about

There are several buses travelling from port Gruz to Pile gates throughout the day, which is opposite the old town. The bus numbers leading to Pile gates are N° 1A, 1B, 1C and 3 and a ticket costs approximately 15 Kuna per person one way.

You can purchase tickets at the newsstand which is located in the bus station, you will need the exact change in Kuna so make sure you convert some money. Buses run approximately every 10 minutes. The bus stop is just outside the port gates on the main road. You can purchase tickets on the bus, however the cost is slightly

Taxis

Taxis will be available in the port area and will cost a set fee per taxi

Mount Srd is a big mountain near Dubrovnik where you will have a stunning view over the city and the bay. It's easy to reach by cable car. A return cable car ticket costs 120 Kuna (approx 16 Euro). Euros are not accepted so please make you have the

Placa Street is in the central street of the Old Town of Dubrovnik. It's about 300 meters long with many shops, restaurants and cafes.

Dubrovnik Cathedral is a Romanesque cathedral from the 12th - 14th century. It was a luxury basilica with many sculptures and is a sight well-worth seeing.

Church of St. Blaise is a church from 1715. It was built by the Venetian architect Marino Gropelli.

Tourist information

The tourist information point is located at Pile gates near to the entrance of the walled city

Internet access

Internet access is available at most of the local cafes and restaurants; this is typically free if you purchase a drink or food.

Nearest beaches

Copacabana Beach is located on the Lapad peninsula and is one of the most popular beaches in Dubrovnik. You'll find variety of water

Cava Beach is one of Dubrovnik's best beaches, located on the Lapad peninsula with spectacular views of the sea and the lush Daksa Island. The beach features the Coral Beach Club offering a bar, sun beds, umbrellas and VIP lounges.

Banje Beach is a pebbled beach located not far from the old town and offers an amazing view of Dubrovnik's walls and the island of

Sv. Jakov is one of the most beautiful beaches in Dubrovnik in a little bay below the church of Sv. Jakov.

Shopping

PLEASE NOTE: As with all tourist destinations. always ensure you keep a close eve on your valuables.

The best place to shop in Dubrovnik is in the Old City. Along the Placa street you will find small designer boutiques and souvenir shops. There is an open-air market on the Gundulic square opposite the palace of the Rector, you can find local products such as caramelized almonds and orange peel, cheese, plum liqueur (Sljivovica), wine, olive oil and perfumed soap. Also, jewelry, shoes and leather

goods are often still hand made.
