AT A GLANCE

Depending on where we tender at Georgetown, it will either be a couple of steps into the town or a short 5 minute walk away from the port.

Taxis without meters will be available outside the dock. Be sure to confirm a fixed rate before getting in, even if a rate is displayed. Please note, majority of the taxis are actually minibuses and may require a minimum of four passengers before they will take you anywhere.

You are also able to hail **minibuses** along the main routes. To hail one, respond with a wave when the driver toots his horn. The bus station is located next to the library which is across from Hero's Square Fountain. The bus route stops at popular attractions such as Dolphin Discovery and the town of Hell.

Tourist Information is available in Georgetown and is located in the Royal Walter Terminal building.

DON'T MISS OUT ON

The Town of Hell: A unique tourist attraction, Hell is a rock formation consisting of around 2 acres of jagged black iron-shore limestone. You can purchase souvenirs and mail a postcard that's postmarked "Hell.."

Approximately a 20-minute drive from Georgetown.

Seven Mile Beach: Well known for it's 5.5 miles of coral sands and crystal clear water, Seven Mile Beach has previously received the honour of "The Caribbean's Best Beach". It offers a variety of beachfront bars and water sports and you can jump on a shuttle bus outside the terminal which will take you to the public areas of the beach.

Cayman Islands National Museum: Featuring changing exhibits on the islands human and natural history, the Cayman Islands National Museum is housed in the oldest public building on the Grand Cayman. It is located a few minute walk away from the cruise port.

Bayshore Mall: Just minutes away from the port in downtown George Town, Bayshore Mall is a popular destination offering a variety of clothing, jewellery stores and restaurants.

EXCURSION OF THE DAY

Grand Cayman Island Tour: Grand Cayman is the largest of the Cayman Islands. On this trip, you'll explore three towns, including the capital city and a coastal town called Hell – yes, Hell. You'll meet your guide at the port and head first to Camana Bay – a high-end waterfront town. Here, you'll head to the top of a 75-foot-tall observation tower, where you can snap some photos of the coast. Next, you'll drive along Seven Mile Beach one of the most popular sandy strips in the Caribbean to Hell. On the way, you'll get a glimpse of the Governor's Mansion – a swish, whitewashed villa that's home to the Cayman Islands' head of state. When you arrive in Hell, you'll take a look at its collection of black, tooth-shaped rock formations. They look like they belong in the underworld, and that's how the town got its gloomy name. You'll also be able to send a souvenir postcode to your friends and family from the crimson-coloured post office. When you're done, you'll head back to the port, stopping off in George Town for a chance to shop for souvenirs like seashell jewellery and bottles of rum.
