GETTING ABOUT...

Kingstown is best known for its West Indian feel being a great place to relax on the beach and stroll the cobblestone streets. The town gets its unique atmosphere from the locals within the area, also the colonial buildings within and around the town.

When we dock in Kingstown, you'll find that finding your way around is quite easy as the area is very accessible from the port. Kingstown market is only a short walk away and is great for local purchases. Or, if you fancy a visit to the Botanical Gardens or nearby beaches, this is also fairly easy. A short 10-15 minutes walk from the port will take you into the small town of Kingstown. The town has a simple layout with three streets running parallel to the waterfront, making it very easy to get around on foot.

Alternatively, you'll find that taxis are available from just outside the terminal building. It's strongly recommended to agree on a rate and the currency before starting your journey.

TOP TIPS

SHOWSTOPPER SIGHT

Montreal Botanical Gardens

Opened in 1765 and being home to a breadfruit tree brought over from Tahiti, this place is a green fingered history fest, jam packed with beautiful nature & scenery this is an area to defiantly have your camera at the ready.

CULTURE VULTURES

Fort Duvernette

Perched on top of a large volcanic rock offshore from Villa, this fort was constructed to defend the town of Calliaqua and affords fantastic 360-degree views of the southern shoreline. There are 225 steps in the spiral staircase that has been carved into the rock.

SHOPPERS PARADISE

Kingstown Town & Port

At the corner of Bay and Bedford street, there's a lively and colourful market. The cruise ship terminal building also has small shops, which are great for souvenirs. There are also some permanent stalls in the market building.

SUN-SEEKERS

Villa Beach

The nearest beach is Villa Beach. This is easily accessible by taking a water taxi from outside the terminal. It takes 10 minutes, costing around \$15 US for a return trip. The beach is local and fairly narrow & has sunbeds.
