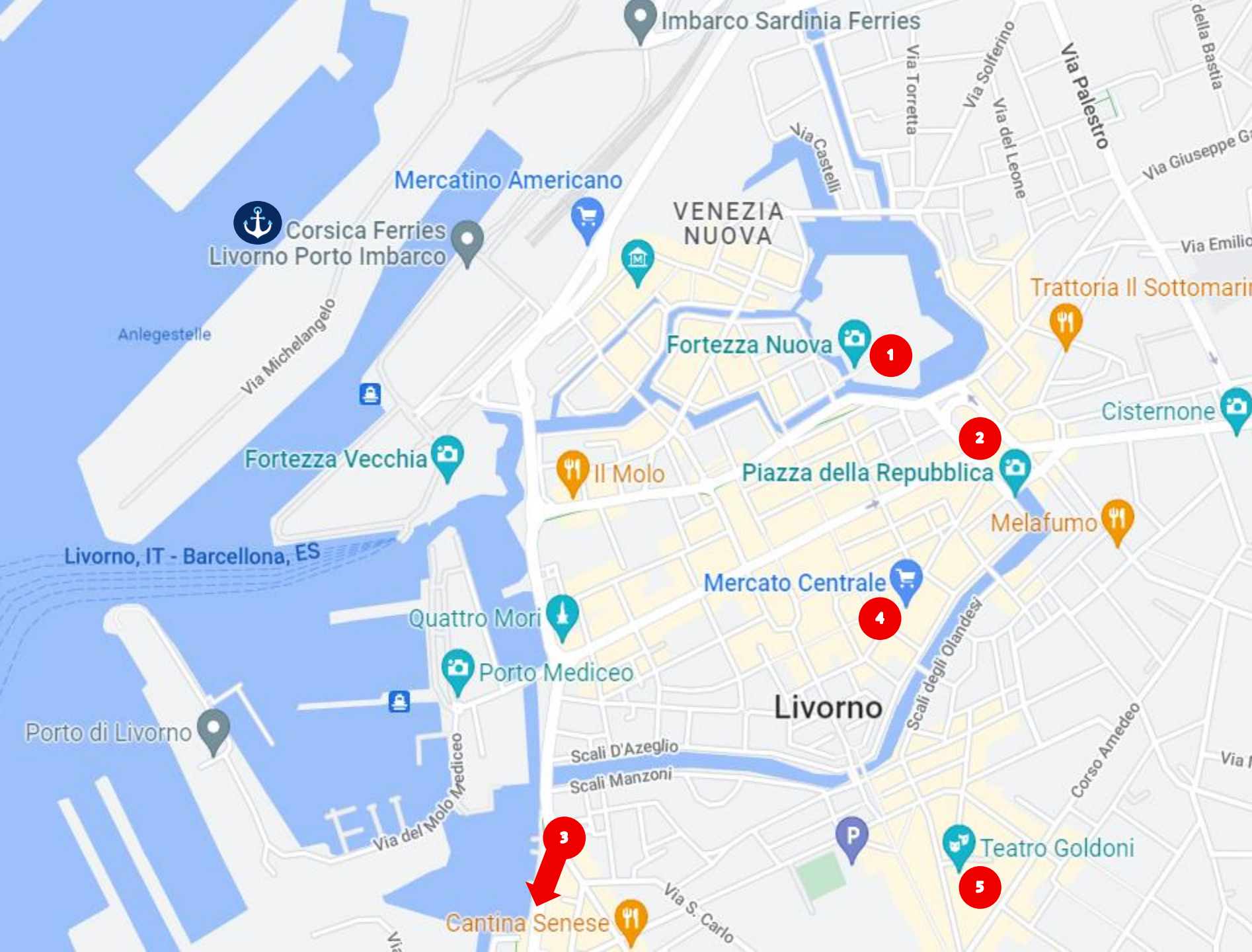


SHIP'S LOCATION

AT A GLANCE

Livorno is the third largest port in Italy and the gateway to Tuscany. It's a small town, but has plenty of boutiques, cafes and restaurants to take a stroll around.

There's a few different docking locations here. You're unable to walk through the port, so a shuttle bus service is provided by the port authorities to drop you off at the main square. A return ticket is around €5. The distance from the pier to the shuttle area is approximately a 5 minute walk.

Wanting to travel further afield? There's a train station which is a 30 minutes walk from the town centre. If you take the train to Pisa, once off the train at Pisa station it's approximately a 20 minute walk to Miracle Square where the Leaning Tower can be found.

DON'T MISS OUT ON

Cathedral of San Francesco d'Assisi was built between 1595-1606 and then rebuilt in the 1950s to its original form after destruction during WWII. You'll find it in the city centre on Piazza Grande.

Fortezza Vecchia: This medieval fortress contains the life and history of the city. Dating back to the medieval era, it acted as a defence to the southern side of the city. It suffered significant damaged during WWII, but after restoration it's now open to the public.

Venice Quarter: Away from the busy streets of the centre, you'll find this charming area of the city which has a resemblance of Venetian architecture with its canals, bridges and colourful buildings.

Shopping: Livorno's main shopping is without doubt Via Grande, big name Italian and international designers can be found here. Via Ricasoli is another great spot for shopping. Shops generally close for siesta around 13.00.

Please follow any local regulations in regards to Covid-19 precaution measures. You may need to present proof of vaccination in some venues so please have it handy.

EXCURSION OF THE DAY

Florence & Pisa: The city of art, Florence has so much to offer, from grand old Renaissance churches to timeworn Medieval streets. An escort will accompany you to Florence, where you'll start your guided visit. The city's historical centre is now a pedestrian zone and this is where your sightseeing begins. Clap eyes on the orange-roofed Duomo and weave your way through the pretty maze of streets to the Gothic Old Palace with its ornate courtyard. You'll get to see Ponte Vecchio, too, the only bridge in Florence to survive the World War II bombings. After that, you'll have some free time to explore, whether you want to visit the famous galleries or just tuck into a tasty lunch in the sun. Then it's time to head for your second city of the day – Pisa. Once you get here, it's approximately a 15 minute walk to the Miracle Square to see the famous Leaning Tower, one of the most recognised sites in the world.
