AT A GLANCE

Palamos is located at the foot of the coastal mountains in the heart of Spain's Costa Brava, with its harbour being one of the main social and economic centres in Catalonia due to its location.

It takes around 15 minutes to walk to the town from the ship, or there is usually a complimentary port-run shuttle bus outside the terminal building. Taxis are generally available outside the port gates. Expect to pay around 1 Euro a minute.

Travelling further afield? Figueres is around an hour's drive away, Girona is about a 50 minute journey and Barcelona is around 1 hour away. There are no trains or direct transport to Barcelona from Palamos, so we recommend joining one of our excursions.

DON'T MISS OUT ON

Fishing Port: A throwback to the towns humble origins. Here the yachts are traded out for fishing boats which return every day with freshly caught fish. Tuck into their local delicacy of Palamos Prawns, famous for their vibrant red colour.

Museu de la Pesca: This fishing museum is located near to the port and pays homage to the fishing and maritime heritage of the Costa Brava.

Santa Maria del Mar: Dating back to the 15th century, this church can be found in the middle of the town along with Santa Eugenia.

Beaches: The nearest beach is Plaja Palamos and is around a 15 minute walk from the port. The beach can be seen from the port area and stretches along the coast.

Shopping: Explore the local shops of Palamos located in the centre of the town. Find souvenir shops, clothes shops and local shops within a 15 minute walk from the ship.

Don't forget... It's usually siesta time in Spain between 14.00 - 17.00, so plan your time ashore accordingly.

EXCURSION OF THE DAY

Mini Train & Medieval Villages: You'll get to explore the Medieval village of Pals today, which is tucked away in the north of Spain. The day starts with you boarding a trolley train for a ride through the region's rustic countryside. On board, you'll learn all about the process of rice-making – famous in this part of the country. Through carriage speakers, a guide will chart the entire journey of the paella-staple, from the seeding of the paddies to the harvest of the grain, and the grinding at the mill to its final merchandising. Plus, you'll get to soak up views of the vast rice fields and the soaring Montrgri Mountain on the way.
