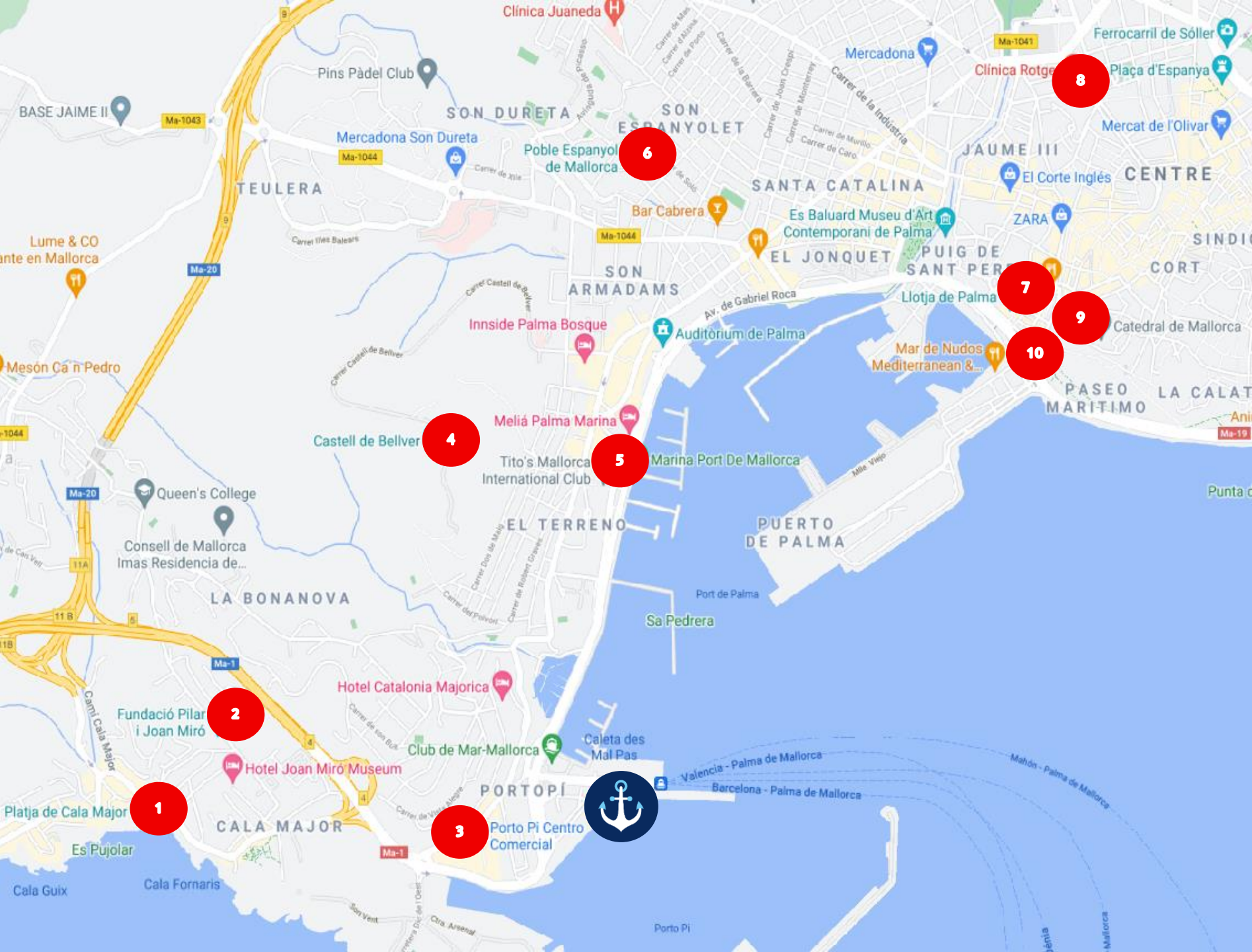

AT A GLANCE

Palma is for sure Majorca's brightest treasure, dating back to the 13th century. Depending on our docking location, the old town is usually a 30-40 minute walk, following the harbour in the direction of the cathedral. Taxis are usually available from outside the port area.

Depending on the time of year, there are usually Hop-on Hop-off buses which stops on the main road outside the port area. Tickets can be purchased on the bus.

DON'T MISS OUT ON

Santa Maria Cathedral: More commonly referred to as La Seu, is a Gothic Roman Catholic cathedral. This breath taking structure overlooks the Bay of Palma and is one of Palma's most well-known and easily spotted attractions.

Museu de Mallorca: An archaeological museum filled with relics from different eras. It has a section devoted to the arts from a mix of Spanish artists. Entrance is free.

La Llotja: This gothic style building used to hold the cities markets but is now home to a permanent art exhibition. It is located near to the Harbour where you will find an array of cafes.

Bellver Castle: An unusual 14th century castle with a unique round tower set at the top of a pleasant park.

Shopping: Palma town centre is home to both high-street shops and designer names. Closer to the port is the Porto Pi shopping centre with over 100 shops, bars and restaurants. It's usually siesta time in Spain between 14.00 - 17.00, so plan your time ashore accordingly.

Beaches: Cala Major is the closest and easiest beach to get to. It takes around 10 minutes to reach by taxi. Alternatively, you could take a trip to Palma Nova.

Please follow any local regulations in regards to Covid-19 precaution measures. You may need to present proof of vaccination in some venues so please have it handy.

EXCURSION OF THE DAY

Soller Train: Explore Majorca's rugged interior on the 'Tren de Soller'. This is no ordinary train journey. It's a vintage electric train that's been chugging through the countryside since the 1912s - heading from Palma to Soller, a gorgeous little village on the northwestern coast. The old-fashioned train ride, which lasts an hour, has become Majorca's most popular attraction and the island really makes the most of its chance to shine. You'll trundle by almond and olive groves. Slide in slow-motion through dinky villages. And clickety-click past pine-clad peaks. When you arrive in Soller, you take a walking tour of the town to catch a glimpse of houses that date back to the 16th-century.
