AT A GLANCE

Uncover the heartbeat of Malaysia and make tracks to the vibrant and bustling capital city of Kuala Lumpur. Its iconic skyline offers a fusion of architectural marvels and urban grandeur.

We'll be docked in Port Klang which is an industrial port, located around 40km from Kuala Lumpur. The local town situated near the port is very small and doesn't offer any sites or facilities.

OUT AND ABOUT

Batu Caves: Guarded by a giant gold statue of a Hindu God, the Batu Caves are a cherished Malaysian gem. As you tackle the 272 steep steps leading into the cave complex, you'll be greeted by dazzling Hindu shrines and temples, revealing the religious significance of this place.

Petronas Towers: The bobby-dazzler of the iconic Kuala Lumpur skyline. Completed in 1998 and standing at 452 meters tall, the Petronas Towers once held the title of the Worlds Tallest Buildings. Head up to the 42nd floor and take in the picture perfect panorama's of the buzzing city.

Independence Square: Flick back the history books at Merdeka Square, where Malaysia's independence was declared in 1957. The square is surrounded by impressive colonial-era buildings, including the Sultan Abdul Samad Building. It's the perfect spot to take a glimpse into the country's past.

Kuala Lumpur Tower: Take in a full 360-degree view of Kuala Lumpur from the observation deck of the iconic 421-metre-tall tower.

FURTHER AFIELD

Beyond Kuala Lumpur's glass, steel, and concrete you'll find plenty of green spaces and natural attractions for a little downtime. Just a bit further from the hustle and bustle of the city, you can explore lush forested hills with hiking trails leading to picturesque waterfalls.

SHOPPING

Experience the vibrant atmosphere of Bukit Bintang, Kuala Lumpur's shopping and entertainment district. You'll find an array of shopping malls, street markets and restaurants options here. It's the perfect hub to indulge in local cuisine and shop for souvenirs.

DO IT LIKE THE LOCALS

Kuala Lumpur is a culinary paradise for street food enthusiasts, offering a diverse range of flavours and dishes influenced by the city's multicultural population. Jalan Alor is a 500-metre long food street and known to be one of the busiest in the world. Take your taste buds on a ride and sample dishes from satay and barbecued chicken wings to frog leg porridge and oyster omelettes.
