approximately.

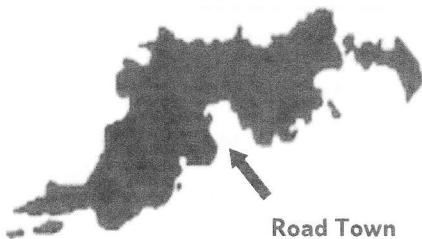

GETTING ABOUT

When we arrive into the port, called Road Harbour it is very easy to explore independently. Most facilities are within easy walking distance. The major asset in Road Town, however, is the ferry docks. For those who want to see what the British Virgin Islands are really about, the ferries are your best friends.

To walk into the town it will take around 10-15 minutes from the port area. You'll need to walk past the market stalls on the left, across the waterfront drive and the Plaza, and then turn right into the main town centre and you'll be at the busiest point of the town.

Alternatively, you can use the safari cabs and mini vans that are available from the port area. Taxi stands are at the cruise pier in Road Town, Soper's Hole or near Wickham's Cay. It's always best to confirm a price before heading out.

The roads on Tortola are very steep and winding. If this makes you uneasy, avoid the safari cabs.

JUST SO YOU KNOW...

As with all tourist cities, pick-pockets can operate in crowded areas so please be mindful of your possessions.

Smoking in public places has been banned in the BVI as a result of a law passed by the Legislative Council. Please do not smoke in any public areas or face a fine.

TOP TIPS

SHOW STOPPER

Virgin Gorda

Leave Tortola behind and get to know another of the British Virgin Islands It's known for the Baths, a labyrinth of beachside boulders forming a series of pools and seawater-flooded grottoes & white sand beaches.

CULTURE CULTURES

Sage Mountain National Park

Sage National Park provides the postcard-pretty setting for this rainforest hike. Home to the highest point in the Virgin Islands, the park is famous for its dramatic landscape so be ready for some spectacular views.

SUN-SEEKERS

Cane Garden Beach

The popular Cane Garden Beach is recommended to visit with its white sands and translucent waters. The beach is approximately a 25 minute taxi journey away. Always negotiate a price before getting into the taxis.

SHOPPERS PARADISE

Old Main Street

Across Waterfront Drive is the Old Main Street of Road Town now known as Pickenin Road. It's a very narrow, winding street that is crammed with small tourist gift boutiques, restaurants, a coffee shops.
