Taxis

Taxis are available from the end of the quayside. Always confirm a price before setting off.

Important info Due to the recent hurricanes which effected Tortola quite badly, some roads throughout the island are not in a pristine condition and will not be accessible. Additionally, the Governments House, Pusser's Landing, Botanical Gardens and Dolphinarium are currently not accessible due to damage caused by the hurricanes. Please take extra care when going

ashore independently.

Main Highlights

The territory of the British Virgin Islands (GBVI or BVI), an archipelago comprising 36 islands, lies east of Puerto Rico and immediately northwest of the U.S. Virgin Islands (USVI), its culturally dominant neighbor. Under British rule from the seventeenth century onward, the BVI has been a crown colony with a ministerial government since 1960. The islands belong to a group known as the Leeward Islands which are part of the Lesser Antilles island chain. Other islands in the group include Anguilla, Antigua and Barbuda, Dominica, Guadeloupe, Montserrat and St Kitts and Nevis. The archipelago of the Virgin Islands is divided into two territories, the British Virgin Islands, and the United States Virgin Islands.

Tortola is the largest of the islands in the British Virgin Islands.

The highest point in the BVI is Mount Sage (521 m) on the island of Tortola.

Most of the Virgin Islands are of volcanic origin. The island of Anegada, one of the largest in the BVI group, is a coral and limestone island.

Amerindian people were early settlers in the Virgin Islands.

Christopher Columbus, in the service of Spain, visited the islands in 1493.

Columbus named the islands "Las Virgines" after the story of St Ursula and her virgin companions. The British Virgin Islands were colonized by the Dutch in 1666. (The United States Virgin Islands

were a colony of Denmark until 1917). African slaves were brought to the islands to work on the sugarcane plantations.

The [British] Virgin Islands were annexed by the British in 1672.

Due to damage caused by the recent hurricanes the popular Cane Garden Beach is not recommended to visit as currently the beach is not in a good condition. The nearest beach is Long Bay Beef island. Just so you know... There are currently no facilities available at the beach.

Shopping

PLEASE NOTE: As with all tourist destinations, please keep a close eve on valuables.

Most of the shops are in a central area and are within walking distance of the pier. Road Town has worked diligently to be ready for the ships to return; however you may still find some facilities closed.

Across Waterfront Drive is the Old Main Street of Road Town now known as Pickenin Road. It's a very narrow, winding street that is crammed with small tourist gift boutiques, restaurants, a coffee shop, bakery, bookshop, island jewellery stores, interiors shops and more. It's well worth a wander down this road. Some of these shops will be closed due the recent hurricanes
