Wander north along O'Daly Street and you will come to the Plaza de España, considered the most important examples of Renaissance architecture in the Canary Islands. It is the historical centre of the town, flanked by the Town Hall with its interesting portico, carved

The quickest and easiest way to reach the town is by foot. Walk along the quay, which will lead you to the start of the town.

Taxis

Taxis are available from outside the terminal, Most fares are set, however if a ride is not metered, we suggest that you agree a price with the driver before entering the taxi. A 10 minute journey will costs approximately €15.

Along one of side of Plaza de España, stands

the Church of El Salvador. It started being built back in the 16th century. Highlights on the outside of the church include the adjoining

tower built of volcanic stone blocks. The building is divided into three naves covered in Mudéjar-style patterns. The main feature on the altarpiece of the high chapel is a painting of the Transfiguration by the Sevillian painter

Antonio María Esquivel.

Main highlights

The capital of La Palma, Santa Cruz claims to be one of the most attractive towns in the Canary Islands, with its tree lined squares and elegant houses. The most north-westerly of the Canary Islands, La Palma benefits from the moisture bearing northeast trade winds, which enable the island to live up to its sobriquet 'La Isla Verde', or the Green Island. Hills surround the town on the landward side, and the main shopping and the commercial area, Calle Real, lies just behind the waterfront. Sometimes known as O'Daly street after an Irish trader and prominent politician, this street is lined by fine old buildings with elaborately carved balconies.

The Salazar Palace stands between the port area and Plaza de España. Near at hand is the Municipal Theatre of 'Circo de Marte' of the Virgen de la Luz.

At the northern end of Santa Cruz, just off the

Plaza de la Alameda in the Avenue de las

Nieves, you will find the Naval Museum built as a full sized stone replica of Columbus' 'Santa Maria'.

On the seafront, stands the Castillo de Santa Catalina, built in the 17th Century to fend off pirate raids. Across the ravine is the smaller Castillo de la
