GETTING ABOUT

There are complementary shuttles buses that will take you to the port gates from the quayside. The quayside can be uneven due to the improvement works so please watch your footing when walking on the quayside.

Once outside the port gates, there are local taxis and tuk tuks available - we always recommend that you agree the price before leaving. As this is a third world country, local vehicles do not comply to EU standards.

JUST SO YOU KNOW...

- Take care of your personal belongings and don't put wallets or mobile phones in back pockets. Phsar Leu Market for example is very busy, so be aware of your belongings.
- Tuk Tuks are the local transportation here-they come in many shapes and sizes so they may not be what you expect. Always arrange a price before you get in.
- When leaving the port gates expect to see a lot of poverty and children begging or trying to sell you tours.
- Sihanoukville is a developing resort-so expect to see a lot of building work.
- Be careful when crossing roads as there aren't zebra crossings.
- At local temples and tourist sites you'll see people with missing limbs which
 is a reminder of the war in Cambodia in recent years and the mine fields
 that have been left behind.

TOP TIPS

SUN-SEEKERS

Ochheuteal Beach

This is a long, sandy stretch with a cluster of restaurants in the middle. Grass umbrellas, rentable beach chairs and little drink huts line the beach from one end to the other.

CULTURE VULTURES

Kampot Village

Lying on the Preaek Tuek Chhu River in southern Cambodia, Kampot is known for its pepper plantations and salt fields.

SHOWSTOPPER

Wat Krom Temple

This is one of the most popular temples because of its unique and beautiful architecture and charming view over Sihanoukville and the sea.

SHOPPERS PARADISE

Phsar Leu Market

This is the biggest collection of traditional stalls in Sihanoukville with everything from fresh seafood to souvenirs on sale.
