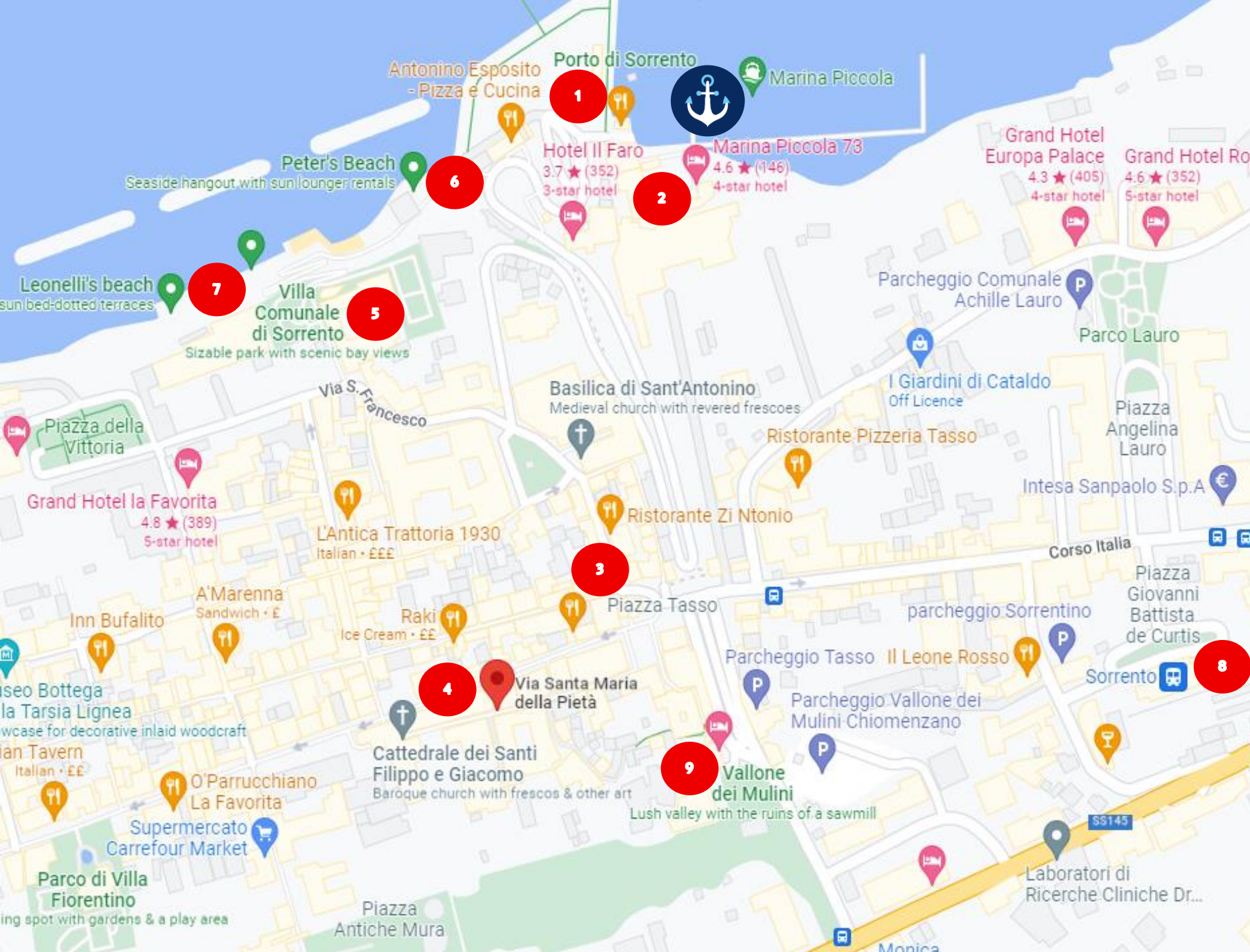


TENDER DROP-OFF

AT A GLANCE

Sorrento is a tender port which means we'll use the ships boats to take you from ship-to-shore. Check your Cruise News the evening before our call for more information about this.

The tender boats will drop you off at Marina Piccola which is a steep uphill walk from the town. If you want an easier way into the town, you could take the blue bus from the terminal which coasts around €1 and drops off at Piazza Tasso. You could instead choose to take a ten minute walk towards the beach clubs in Marina Piccola to grab a ticket to use the Sorrento Lift. This costs around €1.90 for a return ticket and whizzes you up to the Villa Comunale Park.

Fancy making your way to Pompeii? You can grab the Circumvesuviana train from Sorrento which will take you to Pompeii in around 30 minutes or you could get to Herculaneum (Ercolano) in about 50 minutes. Make sure to validate your ticket before riding and bare in mind trains can get crowded and are prone to strikes.

DON'T MISS OUT ON

Pompeii: The ancient city of Pompeii was destroyed when Vesuvius erupted. It was covered in a layer of ash, preserving the ruins and leaving one of the best archaeological sites around.

Piazza Tasso: This sunny, open piazza hugs the edge of the old town and is the main hub of activity in Sorrento. it's a people watchers dream with a string of cafes and restaurants sat in sunshine-yellow buildings.

Shopping: Corsa Italia is the main street of Sorrento with a bunch of high end fashion shops and boujie boutiques.

Beaches: Sorrento is home to a couple of beaches, in general they're rather small with volcanic sand or pebbles although there are some resorts on platforms suspended above the sea. These beaches get very crowded in the summer months and prices for loungers/umbrellas can be rather high.

Please follow any local regulations in regards to Covid-19 precaution measures. You may need to present proof of vaccination in some venues so please have it handy.

EXCURSION OF THE DAY

Pompeii and Herculaneum: Way back, before even the Bible was on the scene, Pompeii was smothered below seven metres of ash. At the same time, Herculaneum disappeared under a flood of mud and lava. Both cities are well-preserved but Herculaneum is smaller and more perfectly formed. While Pompeii burned in its ash shroud, Herculaneum was protected by its muddy crust. At both sites you'll get a guided tour and some free time to explore under your own steam.
