GETTING ABOUT

St George's is known for being one of the most picturesque towns in the Caribbean. It's a fabulous place to explore on foot, from handsome old buildings to the Carenage harbour.

When you leave the port, you'll see that there are two main terminals, both are located the same distance as the local town. Heading out on foot is very accessible and is around a ten minute leisurely walk from the old port.

You'll find local taxi services operating from the port who can take you into the town, charging approximately \$10 USD per taxi ride. If you're going to use the local taxi services to go further afield, its recommended to use the services that are at the old port, directly outside the port gates. It's always best to confirm the price and the currency you would like to pay in before heading out.

TOP TIPS

SHOWSTOPPER

Underwater Sculpture Park

Underwater gallery beneath the surface of the sea, just north of St George's in Molinière Bay. The project was founded by British artist Jason de Caires Taylor and there are now around 80 works in varying condition all slowly becoming encrusted with coral growth.

CULTURE VULTURES

Fort Frederick

Constructed by the French in 1779, Fort Frederick was soon used paradoxically by the British in defence against the French, although it never fired a cannon in anger. It's the island's best preserved fort.

SUN-SEEKERS

Grand Anse Beach

Use the water taxis which are available from just outside the terminals costing around \$5 US per person, per journey. new terminal, Pinguoin Beach (known as Pink Gin) is further but quieter.

JUST SO YOU KNOW...

It gets dark in Grenada around 17.30, just bear this in mind if you're exploring independently.

As with all tourist destinations, pick-pockets can operate in crowded areas so please be mindful of your possessions.

SHOPPERS PARADISE

Market Square

This is a popular market, in the commercial centre selling all different local crafts. There are also a number of duty free and souvenir shops in the Esplanade shopping mall, by the new terminal.
