GETTING ABOUT...

When we arrive at the port of Antigua and if you're looking to explore the port independently, you'll see that the town is a simple and short five minute walk from either of the two docking locations. You could easily spend a couple of hours on foot exploring the town, shopping and having a bite to eat.

Alternatively, as a popular way of transport you'll find a taxi booth located outside the pier where there are set rates to certain destinations. Please be aware some taxis will not leave until all seats are filled. Always confirm the price and the currency you would like to pay in before setting off with a local taxi.

There's also a main bus station located across from the Public Market Complex, between Valley Road and the water within a five minute walk from the either docking locations. The small No. 17 bus runs to Nelson's Dockyard approximately every half hour, however it's a very limited service so it's always best to double check routes and departure times before you head out on these services.

JUST SO YOU KNOW ...

As with all tourist destinations, pick-pockets can operate in crowded areas so please be mindful of your possessions.

Please remember that no combat or camouflage clothing can be worn in Antigua.

TOP TIPS

SHOWSTOPPER SIGHT Shirley Heights

One of the Islands most famous view points which is located in the English Harbour where you can get take in the scenery and capture the perfect photo. In the 18th century, soldiers used this as a lookout podium to spy on enemies and signal to nearby forts.

CULTURE VULTURES

<u>Nelson's Dockyard</u> Nelsons Dockyard is one of the Islands cultural heritage sights and was a focal point for the establishment of the British Navy base since 1632. The world's only working dockyard with Georgian buildings and even visit the original Naval Officer's house.

SUN-SEEKERS

Dickinson's Bay The nearest beach to the port area is Dickinson's Bay which is approx. 20 minutes taxi ride away, but there are over 365 beaches on the island to choose from.
