Getting around

Distance to town centre	The distance to exit the port gates is just over 2km and from here it's approximately 45 minutes to reach the town centre. The walk from the ship to the town can take up to 1 hour, therefore, we recommend to take the Shuttle Bus or a taxi.	Main highlights	At Tarragona's highest point sits the 12th century cathedral - Catedral de Santa Maria , located within the cathedral is the Museu Diocesà, housing an interesting collection of Catalan art. During festival celebrations it's a Catalonian tradition and sport to build human pyramids. It's the Castellars task to build Castells, the amazing human towers.
Taxis	You will be able to find taxi's either on the quayside or just a few metres from outside the port gates. Most taxis have a meter but if not, make sure you agree a rate with the taxi driver before making your journey.		The Tourist Train from Tarragona takes you along the well-preserved Roman ruins on the World Heritage List of UNESCO and along the most important places of the city. The train station is located on the Rambla Vella. The price is €7 for adults and €3 for children under 12 years. Children aged 0-6 years are free.
Shuttle bus	We will be operating a Shuttle Bus service from the ship to the town at timed departures. Please note at peak times between 09.30 and 11.00 the buses may get busy and there may also be queues. Please see your Cruise News or Destination Services for more information and prices.		Port Aventura , Spain's largest theme park, is on the doorstep in Salou; plus there are several water parks too. We do offer an excursion to the theme park which include transfers and tickets. It's around a 15 minute drive to Port Aventura and entrance tickets cost from €49 for adults and €41 for children aged 4-10 years. Children aged 0-4 years are free.
Main highlights	Tarragona is located on the Mediterranean coast, 60 miles southwest of Barcelona, in the region of Catalonia. Tarragona is considered the most important Roman town in Spain. The Roman Amphitheatre is situated on the coast, just off the Rambla Nova Barcelona is approximately 1 hour 30 minutes drive away – perfect to explore this incredible city full of history, incredible buildings and artwork.
