

EXPLORE ASHORE TOULON











AT A GLANCE

Toulon is located in the south of France, on the French Riviera. It's also the countries second largest naval port, the navy have actually been based here for more than 500 years.

When heading out and about, you'll find that the city centre is located within walking distance from the port. It will take around a 5-10 minute walk from the terminal. Once you leave the port gates, just follow the pedestrian walkway and this will lead you to the harbour.

Want to head further afield? Toulon's train station is only a short distance from the centre. It's around a 15 minute walk from the port, from here you can catch a train to Marseille (approximately one hour) or St Tropez (approximately one and a half hours).

DON'T MISS OUT ON

Museé de la Marine: This maritime museum is a must see for anyone interested in the city's naval history. There's a series of old ship models, as well as the real things dating back to the seventeenth century. Entry to the museum is €6.50.

Cable Car: For a spectacular view of the city, take the cable car up to Mount Faron, you'll reach the summit in less than six minutes. As always, cable cars are weather dependent, so be sure to check they're running. A return ticket is around €8 per adult.

Plages du Mourillon: This set of blue flag status beaches are only a 20 minute stroll from the centre of Toulon. Lie down and soak up the sun, or wander around the bars and restaurants along the promenade.

Shopping: There is a large shopping centre full of all your favourite high-street brands. French markets are all dotted around, with the closest just a five minute walk from the port.

Please follow any local regulations in regards to Covid-19 precaution measures. You may need to present proof of vaccination in some venues so please have it handy.

EXCURSION OF THE DAY

St Tropez & Port Grimaud: Once a sleepy fishing village, St Tropez was catapulted onto the world map in the 1950's by legends like Brigitte Bardot and Sacha Distel. They turned it into the French Riviera's chic capital and these days it's home to the crème de la crème in film and fashion. There are far more luxury yachts than fishing boats moored at the beautiful harbour. After an hour-and-a-half drive from the port, enjoy a guided walk from the waterfront through the old streets. Take a look at the pink and yellow houses, which have been converted into fashionable cafes and pastry shops. You'll see Place des Lices, too, where lots of celebs play petanque in the summer. Later on, make a brief visit to charming Port Grimaud, also known as the Little Venice of France.
