### Getting around

<b>Distance to town centre</b>	The town is 7km from the port	<b>Main highlights</b>	<b>Zadar Town</b> – Starts at the old 'Peoples Square' from there you can explore the Forum. <b>The Church of St. Donat</b> dominates this area & worth exploring. The town is a pedestrian only area.																																								
<b>Taxis</b>	Taxis can be found outside the port. Taxi's can be very expensive so arrange a price before you commence your journey.		You may also want listen to the ' <b>Sea Organs</b> ', constructed by architect <i>Nikola Bašić</i> . As the water moves in and out, it connects with underground pipes which begin to whistle and sound rises up from the stone steps which extend to over 70 metres along the coast.																																								
<b>Local buses</b>	Local buses are infrequent and unreliable, therefore they are not recommended.		Greeting to the Sun – A 22-meter diameter circle. This consists of three hundred multi-layered glass plates with the aim to communicate with light, like the Sea Organs do with sound.																																								
<b>Trolley Train</b>	'All around Old Town' departs every hour on the hour at the Greeting of the Sun. This takes you on a circular trip round the old town.		<b>Zadar Archipelago</b> – This stunning area is made up of around 300 islands surrounded by crystal clear waters. Many areas have been designated as National Parks or UNESCO World Heritage Sites.

### Essential information

<b>Tourist information</b>	The tourist information centre is in the market area of the town.	<b>Shopping</b>	There is a daily market at the Forum in the main square, selling locally grown fruit, vegetables & herbs. Many shops can be found along Siroka Ulica selling a range of souvenirs and quality clothing shops.
<b>Internet access</b>	There is no internet access in the port; however, many cafés and bars in the main town centre have Wi-Fi.	<b>PLEASE NOTE:</b> As with all tourist destinations, always ensure you keep a close eye on your valuables.	When you cross over the bridge into the new town there's not so much going on, so we recommend to stick to the old town.
<b>Nearest beaches</b>	<b>Borik</b> (Known as Puntamika) beach is approx 4.5km from the port. There is a free pebbled area and a part sand/part pebble beach in the same location connected to a hotel which costs approx 10 Kuna entry. Here there are sunbeds and umbrella's available (approx €5). A taxi costs approx €13.		If visiting the Island of Pag make sure to pick up some lace which is locally crafted and famous in the area.
